LABORATORIES

Under the *Public Health Act 1991* and Regulation, laboratories are required to notify the following diseases

## NOTIFICATION MECHANISMS

Please initiate case notification within 24 hours of diagnosis

Notifications should be directed to the local Public Health Unit, except for HIV, which is notifiable only by reference laboratories direct to Communicable Diseases Branch, NSW Ministry of Health.

Laboratories should provide information specified in the Laboratory Notification form, either by phone or in writing.

In order to protect patient confidentiality, notifications must not be made by facsimile machine except in exceptional circumstances and when confidentiality is ensured.
