



Exemption
Public Health (COVID-19 Air Transportation Quarantine) Order (No 4) 2021
Made under the *Public Health Act 2010* (NSW)

I, Dr Michael Douglas, authorised medical practitioner and delegate Minister for Health and Medical Research, under clause 32 of the *Public Health (COVID-19 Air Transportation Quarantine) Order (No 4) 2021 (the Order)*:

- 1) From 28 November 2021 revoke the exemption made by the Minister for Health and Medical Research on 31 October 2021 at 9.41pm and attached to this instrument, and
- 2) From 28 November 2021 hereby grant an Exempt Person an exemption from clauses 8 and 10 of the Order subject to the following conditions:
 1. The Exempt Person must immediately travel directly to their residence (the Premises) in a private vehicle or a taxi or a ride share service.
 2. The Exempt Person must travel to the Premises with a parent or guardian.
 3. The Exempt Person must reside at the Premises for the Specified Period.
 4. While at the Premises during the Specified Period, the Exempt Person must—
 - a. not leave the Premises except—
 - i. for the purposes of obtaining medical care, including a test for COVID-19, or medical supplies, or
 - ii. in another emergency situation, and
 - b. not permit another person to enter the Premises unless—
 - i. the other person usually lives at the Premises, or
 - ii. the entry is for medical or emergency purposes, or
 - iii. the entry is to a place, other than a residence of the Premises, for the purposes of delivering food or essential items
 5. While travelling to the Premises the Exempt Person must take reasonably practicable steps to:
 - a. remain at least 1.5 metres from any other person other than a member of their own household,
 - b. wear a mask,
 - c. only use roadside rest stops if required, and
 - d. not stop at any restaurants, takeaway shops, cafes or any other public areas.
 6. The Exempt Person must seek PCR testing for COVID-19:
 - a. 24 hours after arriving in NSW, and
 - b. 5-6 days after arriving in NSW, and
 - c. if the Exempt Person develops any symptoms of COVID-19.
 7. While travelling to undergo a COVID-19 test, the Exempt Person must travel by the most practicable direct route in a private vehicle or a taxi or a ride share service between the Premises and any testing facility and where practicable wear a mask and remain 1.5 metres from any other person.
 8. For 7 days after the end of the Specified Period, the Exempt Person must comply with the NSW Health Guidelines for Recent Fully Vaccinated Arrivals.

Note: If the Exempt Person develops COVID-19, the Exempt Person may be required to self-isolate at suitable premises under *Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order (No 3) 2021* or an order that replaces that orders.

In this Exemption:

- A country of concern has the same meaning as the Order
- COVID-19 vaccine has the same meaning as the Order
- Exempt Person means a person who has not been in a country of concern in the previous 14 days and who is:
 - a) a person who is older than 12 years of age and under 18 years of age who is not a fully vaccinated arrival and who is accompanied into New South Wales by:
 - i. a parent or guardian who has not been in a country of concern in the previous 14 days and the parent or guardian is either:
 - a fully vaccinated arrival, or
 - not a fully vaccinated arrival because the parent or guardian has a medical contraindication to a COVID-19 vaccine and has a certificate or other documentation from an Australian or overseas medical practitioner that indicates that the person has a medical contraindication to a COVID-19 vaccine,
 - b) a person under 18 years of age who is not a fully vaccinated arrival and who arrives in New South Wales as an unaccompanied minor.
- Fully vaccinated arrival has the same meaning as the Order
- Specified Period for an Exempt Person:
 - a) starts when the person arrives in New South Wales, and
 - b) ends when at least 7 full days have passed since the person arrived in New South Wales and the person has received a negative test result on their COVID-19 test taken on day 5-6 after arriving in NSW

Note: If the Exempt Person develops COVID-19, the Exempt Person may be required to self-isolate at suitable premises under *Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order (No 3) 2021* or an order that replaces that orders.

This exemption can be revoked at any time.

Note: If the Exempt Person travels to another jurisdiction within 14 days after arriving in Australia, they may be subject to restrictions or quarantine in the other jurisdiction.

Exemption

Public Health (COVID-19 Air Transportation Quarantine) Order (No 3) 2021

Made under the *Public Health Act 2010* (NSW)

I, Brad Hazzard MP, Minister for Health and Medical Research, under clause 33 of the *Public Health (COVID-19 Air Transportation Quarantine) Order (No 3) 2021 (the Order)*, do hereby grant an Exempt Person an exemption from clauses 7 and 11 of the Order subject to the following conditions:

1. The Exempt Person must immediately travel directly to their residence (the Premises) in a private vehicle or a taxi or a ride share service.
2. The Exempt Person must travel to the Premises with a parent or guardian.
3. The Exempt Person must reside at the Premises for the Specified Period.
4. While at the Premises during the Specified Period, the Exempt Person must—
 - a. not leave the Premises except—
 - i. for the purposes of obtaining medical care, including a test for COVID-19, or medical supplies, or
 - ii. in another emergency situation, and
 - b. not permit another person to enter the Premises unless—
 - i. the other person usually lives at the Premises, or
 - ii. the entry is for medical or emergency purposes, or
 - iii. the entry is to a place, other than a residence of the Premises, for the purposes of delivering food or essential items
5. While travelling to the Premises the Exempt Person must take reasonably practicable steps to:
 - a. remain at least 1.5 metres from any other person other than a member of their own household,

8. For 7 days after the end of the Specified Period, the Exempt Person must comply with the NSW Health Guidelines for Recent Fully Vaccinated Arrivals.


Note: If the Exempt Person develops COVID-19, the Exempt Person may be required to self-isolate at suitable premises under *Public Health (COVID-19 Self-Isolation) Order (No 3) 2021* or an order that replaces that orders.

In this Exemption:

- COVID-19 vaccine has the same meaning as the Order
- Exempt Person means:
 - a) a person who is older than 12 years of age and under 18 years of age who is not a fully vaccinated arrival and who is accompanied into New South Wales by
 - i. a parent or guardian who is either a fully vaccinated arrival, or
 - ii. a parent or guardian who is not a fully vaccinated arrival because the parent or guardian has a medical contraindication to a COVID-19 vaccine and has a certificate or other documentation from an Australian or overseas medical practitioner that indicates that the person has a medical contraindication to a COVID-19 vaccine,
 - b) a person under 18 years of age who is not a fully vaccinated arrival and who arrives in New South Wales as an unaccompanied minor.
- Fully vaccinated arrival has the same meaning as the Order
- Specified Period for an Exempt Person:
 - a) starts when the person arrives in New South Wales, and
 - b) ends when at least 7 full days have passed since the person arrived in New South Wales and the person has received a negative test result on their COVID-19 test

This exemption commences at the beginning of 1 November 2021 and can be revoked at any time.

Note: If the Exempt Person travels to another jurisdiction within 14 days after arriving in Australia, they may be subject to restrictions or quarantine in the other jurisdiction.
