



Exemption under the *Public Health (COVID-19 Interstate Travellers) Order (No 3) 2021* [NSW] under the *Public Health Act 2010* (NSW)

I, Richard Broome, A/Executive Director Health Protection NSW and delegate of the Minister for Health and Medical Research, under clause 23 of the *Public Health (COVID-19 Interstate Travellers) Order (NO 3) 2021 (Interstate Order)*, hereby grant the following exemption to those orders:

1. Despite clause 10(3) of the Interstate Order, a person can be away from their place of residence for the purposes of feeding and attending to animals but only if no other person is reasonably available to care for the animals subject to the following conditions:
 - a. The person must take the most practicable direct route to and from their residence and the location at which the animals are kept, and
 - b. The person must only remain at the location at which the animals are kept for the minimum period required to feed and attend to those animals.

An exempt person must comply with all other requirements in the Orders.
