Public Health (COVID-19 Border Control) Order 2020

Made under the *Public Health Act 2010 (NSW)*

I, Brad Hazzard, the Minister for Health and Medical Research, under clause 10 of the Public Health (COVID-19 Border Control) Order 2020 (the **Order**):

- 1) and section 43 of the *Interpretation Act 1987*, revoke:
 - a. the exemption signed by me on 21 July 2020 at 9.30 pm and annexed to this instrument;
 - b. the exemption signed by Kerry Chant, Chief Health Officer, on 12 August 2020 and annexed to this instrument;
- 2) grant an exemption to clause 5(1)-(4) of the Order to:
 - a. Persons living in or near the Remote Communities listed in Column 1A of Annexure A in order to obtain essential goods and services (including food, fuel or hygiene products or disability support services necessary to enable the person to live safely and maintain their health) from the towns, or goods and service providers located in the vicinity of the towns, listed in Column 1B of Annexure A, and
 - b. Persons living in or near the Remote Communities listed in Column 2A of Annexure A, in order to transit across the NSW-Victorian Border in order to obtain essential goods and services (including food, fuel or hygiene products or disability support services necessary to enable the person to live safely and maintain their health) from the towns, or goods and service providers located in the vicinity of the towns, listed in Column 2B of Annexure A.

This exemption is subject to the following conditions:

- c. Persons must not move across the Border Zone (as defined in clause 3(1) of the Order) or across the NSW-Victoria border if the essential goods and services referred to in paragraphs 2(a) and (b) are readily obtainable in a timely manner without such movement.
- d. Persons must travel by the most practicable direct route between their place of residence and the essential goods and services providers. Clause 3(1A) of the Order applies to this requirement to travel by the "most practicable direct route".
