**Lynn Gillam** is Professor in Health Ethics at the Centre for Health and Society, in the Melbourne School of Population and Global Health, and she works as Clinical Ethicist at the Royal Children's Hospital in Melbourne and is Academic Director of the Children's Bioethics Centre. She is Chair of the University of Melbourne Human Research Ethics Committee and serves on a number of ethics advisory bodies for state government agencies, professional bodies and the NHMRC.



**Angus Dawson** is Professor of Bioethics and Director of the Centre for Values Ethics and the Law in Medicine at the University of Sydney. Angus has published extensively on many issues in bioethics. In recent years he has been particularly focused on public health ethics (e.g. vaccinations and issues related to lifestyle choices) and the use of empirical evidence in moral arguments (e.g. in relation to problems in gaining informed consent in clinical trials).



**Winston Liauw** is Cancer Services Stream Director at South Eastern Sydney Local Health District. He is a medical oncologist and clinical pharmacologist and currently practices both of these disciplines. He has a special interest in Gastrointestinal Cancer with a special focus on regional and Intraperitoneal Chemotherapy. He holds appointments at St George Public and Private Hospitals.
