What happens if your COVID-19 test is negative?



A negative test result means we didn't find COVID-19.



If you still have symptoms, stay at home until you are well.




You should also stay home if the Public Health Unit asks you to.




If you feel sick again, you will need to get another test.

What happens if your COVID-19 test is positive?



A positive test result means you have COVID-19.



The Public Health Unit will call you.



They will ask you questions about:

- your health
- your symptoms
- who you have seen lately
- where you have been lately
- what support you need.



The Public Health Unit will give you advice about what you can do next.



You will not need to pay for any COVID-19 treatment you need.
