

Forms Required for Cremation in NSW and the Use of Interstate Forms

NSW Forms

- Application for Permission for Cremation (other than still-born children) (Clause 36(1)) **OR**
- Application for Permission for Cremation (still-born children) (Clause 37(1))

Attending Practitioner's Cremation Certificate
(Clause 38(1)(a))

- Medical Referee's Cremation Permit (Other than Still-born Children)(Clause 39(1)) **OR**
- Medical Referee's Cremation Permit (Still-born Children)(Clause 41(1)) **OR**
- Coroner's Cremation Permit (Clause 40(1))

1. Application Form

2. Cremation Certificate if the death is not examinable by Coroner

3. Cremation Permit

Permitted Interstate Forms

No Interstate forms permitted

Victoria: Certificate of Registered Medical Practitioner Authorising Cremation, Regulation 9, Schedule 4, Form 4
ACT: Certificate of Medical Attendant, Approved form AF 2003-22, Section 8 Cemeteries and Crematoria Regulations 2003
Queensland: Cremation Risk Certificate, Form 2 or Cause of Death Certificate, Form 9, Cremations Act 2003
South Australia, Tasmania, Western Australia and Northern Territory: equivalent forms may be used.

- No Interstate forms permitted. However:
- NSW Medical Referee's Cremation Permit form may be completed by Medical Referee if from another state / territory only if that medical referee has been appointed by the NSW Health Director – General. **OR**
 - Coroner's Cremation Permit (Clause 40(1)) from any State or Territory of Australia is acceptable.
