HEALTH FORUM FOR GREATER WESTERN SYDNEY

The Minister for Health, Jillian Skinner, will host a community health forum in Parramatta on Wednesday to give Greater Western Sydney residents the chance to have their say on the future of health services in their community.

“This is the first community health forum to be held in Greater Western Sydney where residents can raise issues of concern directly with the government and where Local Health Districts can listen and respond to those concerns,” Mrs Skinner said.

“Medical innovation, mental health services and health resources will be among issues up for discussion.

“It is about genuine engagement with the local community, and a good opportunity to let everyone know how Local Health Districts are delivering health services to the region and to seek input on how we can do it even better.

“I encourage everyone to come along, find out what is happening across Greater Western Sydney and have a say.”
