INNOVATION AND IMPROVEMENT CELEBRATED AT NSW HEALTH AWARDS

Dramatically redesigned food packaging which gives patients greater ease of opening and accessibility to food won the top award for excellence at the NSW Health Awards tonight.

Health Minister Jillian Skinner said *Food Packaging Improvement Project* – a joint HealthShare NSW and Arthritis Australia initiative - won the Minister for Health and Minister for Medical Research Award for Innovation at a gala dinner at the Sydney Showground tonight.

“I am very proud of this project – it is vital the elderly and those with conditions affecting fine motor skills, such as arthritis, can open or easily access food,” Mrs Skinner said.

“Hard-to-open food packaging is not just a source of frustration for patients but a barrier to nutrition – food plays a vital role in assisting patients on the road to recovery.

“HealthShare NSW provides 22 million meals to hospital patients every year. As a result of this initiative NSW Health is the first health system in the world to make easy to open food packaging part of the tender process for our food suppliers.”

Mrs Skinner said tonight’s annual NSW Health Awards were the 16th in the state’s history and continue the focus on delivering innovation right across the health system.

“The NSW Health Awards awards celebrate the excellence of our nurses, clinicians, allied health professionals, support staff and researchers - but they also shine a light on innovation,” Mrs Skinner said.

“As I travel the state, I continue to be inspired by the ground-breaking new models of care being developed locally.

“These wonderful ideas harness new technologies and approaches to ensure high quality, world class health care and enable us to deliver the right care at the right time in the right place.

“The beauty of these ideas is they are being taken to the bedside to benefit patients as well as changing ways of working to assist staff.”

There were 40 finalists in 13 categories for tonight’s awards, with many showcasing their work at the 2014 NSW Health Innovation Symposium earlier in the day.
