Request for Abstracts

Allied health clinicians and researchers employed by or associated with NSW Health are invited to submit an abstract for presentation at the inaugural **Allied Health Research Showcase 2020.**

The **Allied Health Research Showcase** is an excellent opportunity for allied health professionals and researchers in allied health fields in NSW to showcase their research to their peers and help to inform evidence-based clinical practice.

The draft program includes oral presentations (15mins) and lightening talks (3 slides in 3min – template will be provided). Showcase attendees will also be invited to vote on their favourite lightening talk with the top two being invited to present a more detailed oral presentation (15min) the following day.

Abstract Criteria

Successful abstracts will focus on research in one of the <u>23 allied health professions</u> employed in NSW. Clinical redesign or quality improvement projects will not be accepted unless there is a research component to these projects. As a general guide, research projects require ethics approval, unless it is a systematic review.

Abstracts will be assessed on the following criteria with a higher weighting given to translational research.

- 1) Research offers new data, knowledge or demonstrates innovation,
- 2) Potential of the research to change allied health clinical practice,
- 3) Potential of the research to significantly improve patient care, outcomes or service delivery.
- 4) The abstract clearly states the:
 - a. Problem
 - b. Hypothesis / aim of the research
 - c. Methodology used
 - d. Results and findings
 - e. Application of the research to allied health clinical practice and/or patient outcomes.

All presenters will be required to register for the conference and pay the appropriate registration fee.

Guidelines for writing an abstract

- 1. Capture the interest of attendees of the presentation and tell them why they should attend
- 2. Make a clear statement of the topic of the presentation and the research question
- 3. Describe how the research was/is being undertaken
- 4. State the value of the findings and to whom they will be of use
- 5. Describe the work to be discussed in the presentation
- 6. Ensure the abstract is a concise summary of the findings is within the 300 word limit
- 7. Check quality of writing including flow, sequence and correct language, grammar, etc.
- 8. Use the abstract structure provided
