Out of Hospital Cardiac Arrest

A cardiac arrest is not a heart attack.

Cardiac arrest means the heart is no longer pumping blood and oxygen around to the vital organs of the body. Quick action could save a life.

Signs of a heart attack:

- pain in the chest
- difficulty breathing
- nausea
- feeling light-headed
- symptoms may vary from person to person

Signs of cardiac arrest:

• unconscious and

- unresponsive and
- absent or abnormal breathing

If a person is experiencing a heart attack or more serious cardiac arrest, call Triple Zero (000) immediately for an ambulance.
