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Advance Care Planning in Outpatients Clinics Translational Research Grants Scheme (TRGS)

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What is it?

Advance care planning is a **process** of planning for future health and personal care whereby the person's values, beliefs and preferences are made known so they can guide decision-making at a future time when the person cannot make or communicate his/her decisions.



What is the evidence base for ACP?

- Observational studies and RCTs:
 - Reduced burdensome medical care near death
 - Increased likelihood of a person being cared for at EOL according to their wishes*
 - Improved patient/family satisfaction with care*
 - Better quality of dying and satisfaction with EOL care*
 - Reduced stress, anxiety and depression in surviving relatives*

What are we doing?

Pragmatic trial 364 patients Randomised to Intervention and Control.

- Interventions receive facilitated ACP
- Controls receive written information

CNCs will provide training to interested clinicians who wish to participate. But not just training!

- Then sit in with clinicians and patients in OPD setting
- "See One, Do One, Teach One" (or more...)



Evaluation

- Primary Outcome measure is unplanned hospital admissions at 6 months
- Secondary Outcomes @ 6months
 - Acute Health service utilisation
 - Ambulance calls
 - ED presentations
 - Hospital admissions
- Patient/ Caregiver/ Outcomes
- HP attitudes and knowledge
- Health Care Costs



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
