

Our health services for young people are confidential

NSW Health respects your privacy and the services you access are confidential. We will not share your information unless it is necessary.

For your safety and wellbeing, and the wellbeing of others, sometimes we may need to share information about you and your health outside the health service, but we will always try to discuss this with you first. If we think you or someone else is at risk of significant harm or if we have concerns about your safety, welfare or wellbeing, we may need to share the information without your permission. Before doing this, your health worker will try to talk to you about it first.

Your health rights and responsibilities are important to us. For more information about how we protect the confidentiality of information about you and keep your information private, you can:

- Speak to a health worker.
- Refer to the 'We keep it zipped' pocket-sized card at the counter or provided by your health workers (for example the Wellbeing Nurse).
